



USE OF PREOPERATIVE REPORT AS A TEACHING-LEARNING STRATEGY

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The contemporary teaching-learning process extends beyond traditional teaching techniques. Particularly crucial in dentistry is that practical procedures are based on technical-scientific knowledge. To better prepare the dental student at UniEVANGÉLICA for patient care in the teaching dental clinic, encompassing a comprehensive, humanistic, ethical, and evidencebased approach to surgical procedures, a teaching strategy employed is the preoperative report. In this approach, the student is required to outline a general, loco-regional, oral, imaging, and laboratory assessment necessary for treatment planning. Additionally, it includes preparing the patient and the professional regarding surgical asepsis techniques, addressing all surgical steps, including anesthetic techniques, and post-operative care. The report is submitted in a digital format and plays a significant role in learning because during the professor's feedback, the student is able to conduct self-assessment, identifying their strengths and weaknesses, and receiving guidance from the surgery professor on how to overcome the difficulties encountered. This way, they can progress and enhance their behavior and decisionmaking skills when facing clinical situations.

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
